What is Fair Trade?

Fair Trade is an international system of standards that ensures better trading conditions for workers and producers in developing countries. According to TransFair Canada, Fair Trade Certified represents the following criteria worldwide: The minimum price paid reflects the true value of farm labour and includes a social premium to be reinvested in the community;

- Pre-harvest lines of credit are available to the producers if requested;
- Direct trading relationships are established;
- Most products come from democratically organized cooperatives of small producers;
- Sustainable environmental practices are implemented

Fair Trade Certified vs. Fairly Traded Products

Some Fairly Traded products are still quite ethical; they pay fair wages to workers and invest in the local community. However, because they do not meet the standards of the above labeling organizations (or have not undergone the certification process), they are not labeled. It is hard for some growers to be Fair Trade Certified and Labeled due to the high standards and growing procedures of the FLO. The FLO is adapting to this and in time we will see more Fair Trade Certified products on the market as part of that adaptation. How can you tell if a Fairly Traded product is legitimate? It isn't easy; you must do your own research on products that claim to be Fairly Traded.
